### **Language Expectations**

While no formal test is required.

we do encourage incoming exchange students to ensure that their level of English language proficiency meets or exceeds our standard as follows.



### •Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL):

Applicants to all programs except Nursing require a minimum score of 83 (iBT) with a minimum score of 20 in reading, listening and writing, and a minimum score of 22 in speaking. Applicants to Nursing require a minimum score of 93 with a minimum score of 20 in reading and listening and a minimum score of 22 in writing and speaking The Nipissing University TOEFL institution code is #3614

### International English Language Test Service (IELTS):

Applicants to all programs except Nursing require a minimum overall band score of 6.5 with a minimum 6 in reading, listening, speaking and writing. Applicants to Nursing require a minimum overall band score of 7 with a minimum 6.5 in reading, listening, speaking and writing.

### •Pearson Test of English (PTE) Academic:

Applicants to all programs except Nursing require a minimum overall score of 58 with a minimum score of 56 in speaking, writing, reading and listening. Applicants to Nursing require a minimum overall score of 63 with a minimum score of 60 in each section.

### •Canadian Academic English Language (CAEL/CAEL Online):

Applicants to all programs except Nursing require a minimum overall score of 60 with no band less than 60. Applicants to Nursing require a minimum overall score of 70 with no

band less than 60.

### Cambridge English Qualifications:

A C1 minimum overall score of 176 with a minimum score of 169

#### **SEMESTERS**

At Nipissing University courses can either be taught in one semester or over a period of two semesters.

Two semester courses run from September to April and have designated code of FW meaning Fall and Winter. Two semester courses are worth six credits.

Single semester courses are taught in either our Fall semester (FA = September to December) or the Winter semester (WI = January to April). Single semester courses are typically worth 3 credits.



### **ECTS CREDITS**

15 Nipissing University credits = 30 ECTS Credits



### VISA AND STUDY PERMIT FOR CANADA

Under the Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC) regulations, if a student's period of study in Canada is 6 months or less, they are not required to obtain a Study Permit. However, students are encouraged to research the visa criteria to ensure a smooth exchange transition. For students studying for a full academic year (8 months) it is mandatory to obtain a study permit from the country of origin.

Nipissing University is in North Bay a city in Northeastern Ontario, Canada.

The city is located 300 kilometers (190 mi) from both Ottawa and Toronto.

Public transport: bus can easily access most of the campuses.
