Buddy Program (1:1 Mentoring)	Exchange students are provided with 1:1 Mentoring(Buddy) Program within 2~3 weeks after the start date of the semster. Purpose of buddy program is to help the new students get used to the campus life in Korea and interact with Korean students to exchange and experience new culture. One Korean student would be paired with one international student.
Campus Facilities	International students can use various campus facilities such as: KLAS System, Library, Ice Rink, Basketball court, Computer Labs, etc.

International Students Program	 Various programs are conducted exclusively for international students for their better experiences during their stay in Korea. The list of international students' programs is as follows: Kwangwoon International Friends – A student association KIF organizes many different events for international students all around the year. Cultural Experience Program – It provides opportunities to experience Korean traditional and contemporary culture through interesting programs so that students can improve their Korean language skills, deep knowledge on Korean society and culture and enjoy a satisfactory university life. 	
Extra-Curricular Activities	Students have opportunities to join various clubs (music, photography, hip-hop dance, piano, ice hockey, football, basketball, table tennis, etc.) and experience college annual festival in May with popular music and K-pop performances live on stage.	
Student Cafeteria	Student Cafeteria offers breakfast, lunch and dinner with wide range of Korean meals in a reasonable price. Located at Bokji Building.


